

Recognizing colors is an important skill. People often use colors to describe things. Being able to identify colors, as well as letters and numbers builds confidence in children while building a foundation for success in school.

Cut out and color blue ribbons that say “I’m wonderful”, use as a reward for something special or because the child listened to stories about blue today.

Use toilet paper tubes to decorate and create “horns”, and use them while reciting Little Boy Blue.

Go on a neighborhood color walk. Take children out on a walk in your neighborhood for exercise, fresh air and learning opportunities. Make it a point to talk about the colors you see, such as the yellow dandelion, blue sky or brown house.
